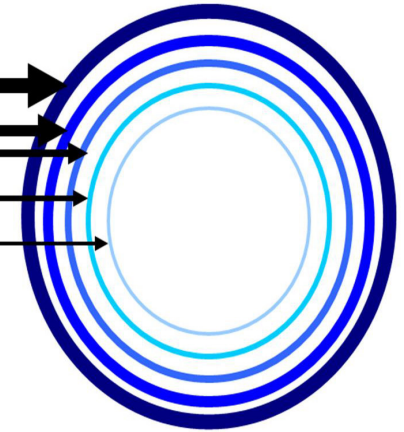

Study Questions for November 29

1. Read Philippians all the way through once this week and 3:1-21 five times this week.
2. What are the top five priorities in your life right now? In order of which gets the most time and energy, list those five out.
3. According to Philippians 3:1-3, how does rejoicing/worshipping the Lord protect us spiritually? Do you think Paul is reflecting on Jeremiah 9:23-26? If so, what are the correlations?
4. Read Philippians 3:4-6. How did Paul once worship "in the flesh" instead of in the Spirit? What does that look like today in your life?
5. Read Philippians 3:7-14. What is Paul's first and foremost priority? How does he describe this one driving priority?
6. Read Philippians 3:15-21. What is the main application for us in lieu of Paul's exhortation to "follow my example" (3:17)? Is it a duty to perform, a mindset to change, a habit to develop or a virtue to cultivate? How does this apply to you specifically?
7. How does the hope of vv. 20-21 strengthen our resolve to make Jesus our number one priority?
